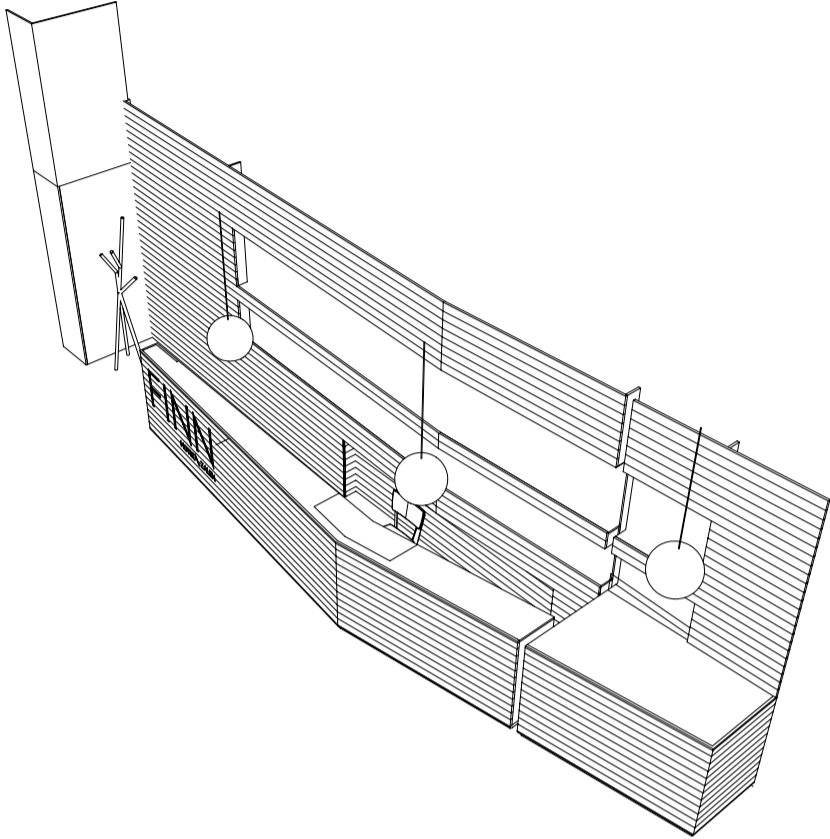

This lobby has been designed for Finn, a Hotel in the city centre of Almere that offers luxury accommodations for a low budget. The goal was to show and define the hotels identity while attracting and inviting people to the second and third floor of the hotel that have been situated out of direct sight. With its distinguishing color gradient and bold interplay of lines the wall panels and counter are eye catchers of the space.

The interior has been realized within a small frame of time and budget. Despite this it had to comply with all necessary functionalities incl. 2 workspaces, a lounge corner, a coffee corner with washing ability and a place to temporarily store suitcases. To include all functionalities while keeping the room spacious and clean, 2 simple ingredients have been used.

The counter functions dually as a spacial volume and a separation element that introduces visitors into the space by its sloping line. Second the colored wood creates a warm environment and clean identity and contrasts the sleek polyester floor and white walls. used to accentuate the shape of the space and to attract the view from the street.

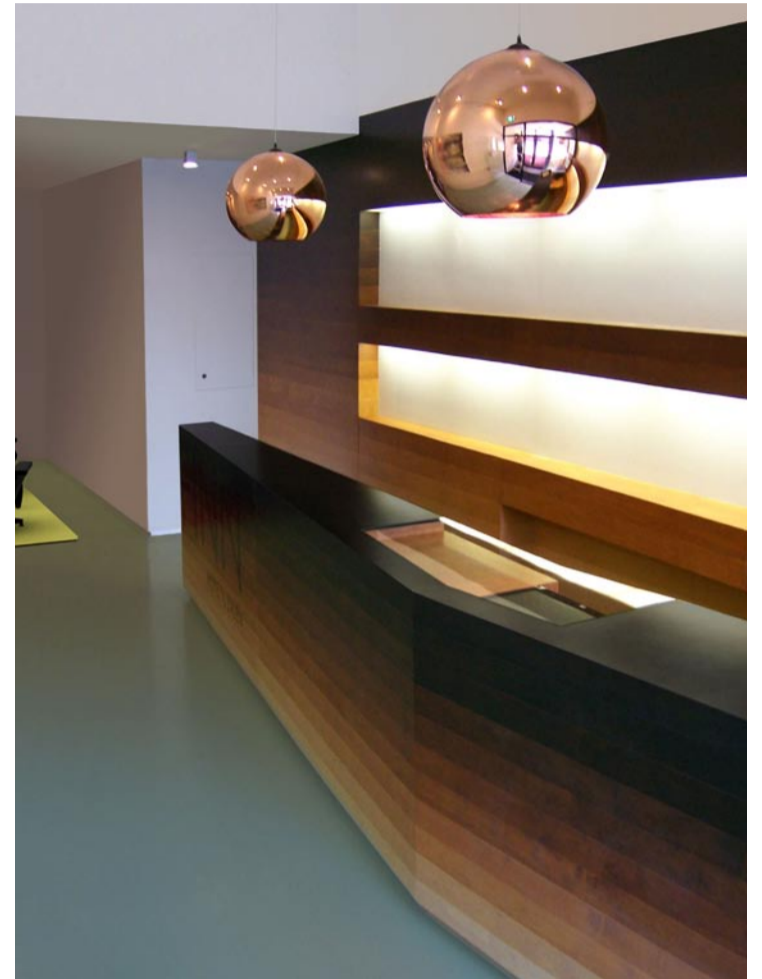
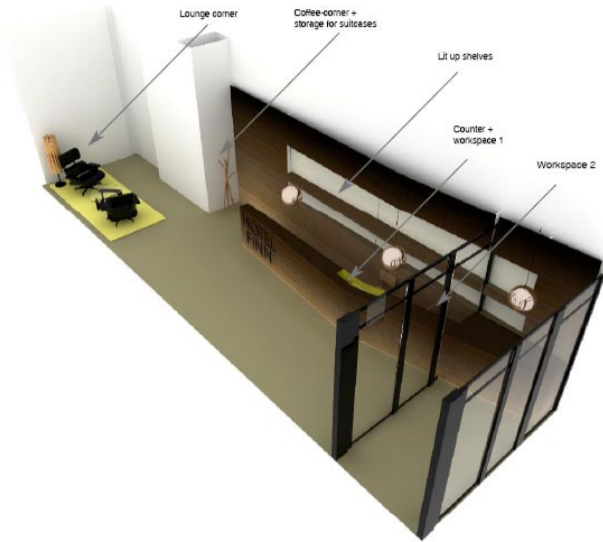

- Additional information

Some details :

- Gradient wood - this custom colored wood can be created in any color and gradient. It is created in sheets of material so it can be processed like regular wood.
- The counter includes a screen that is visible through a plate of hardened glass, in this way the surface of the counter is clean.
- The back wall includes light that is used to accentuate the shape of the space and to attract the view from the street.
- The wall opposite of the counter has a high gloss wainscot to reflect the light and create a strong perspective.
- A wall closet is built in the corner with the wall-panels. This closet includes a coffee corner, a washing facility and temporary space to store luggage.
